We started our last half-term of the year with Father Colin coming into school to celebrate Mass. It was the feast of Saint Justin, who was martyred for his faith, Father spoke about faith, courage and sharing God's love. It was lovely to have everyone back together in the hall – as the year has gone on and everyone has been growing, we just about fit the whole school in the hall.

The hall has been busy this week with all kinds of sporting activities, meetings and workshops. We have also welcomed NSPCC volunteers who have been delivering workshops sharing key messages with years 2 and 5. They are back again to visit the classes they didn't attend today.

Year 5 are really lucky to be taking part in the "Laugh It Off" project. Funded by PH Holt Foundation and delivered by The Comedy Trust, Laugh It Off uses stand-up comedy, storytelling and performance to help primary school children manage stress and build resilience. The programme aims to improve children's mental health, wellbeing and resilience through humour and laughter. Build confidence, communication, oracy and self-expression. Equip children with positive coping strategies for stress, anxiety and setbacks. Create safe, inclusive spaces for children to discuss emotions and difficult topics. Support friendships, social connection and self-esteem through collaborative creative activities. We are really grateful to the Comedy Trust for the invitation to take part.

Air pollution is the biggest environmental risk to our health. Breathing in dirty air impacts us all and is linked to a range of health problems throughout our lives – from premature birth and childhood asthma to heart and lung disease, diabetes and strokes in later life. 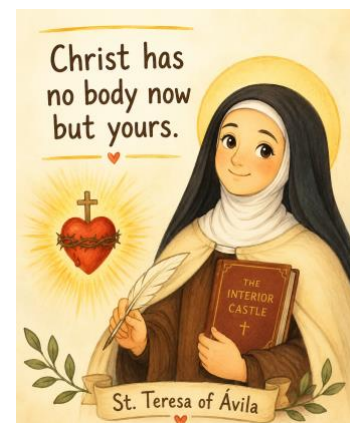
